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Core Functions of Public Health

- Assessment
 - Assess health of population
 - Collect, analyze, and disseminate information
 on health of community
- Policy Development
 - Use scientific knowledge to make decisions and develop policy
- Assurance
 - Make needed services available and accessible to entire population



Essential Service	Examples
#1 . <u>Monitor</u> Health Status to identify community health problems	 Assess community's health Determine needed services Collect data (e.g., vital statistics) Analyze & disseminate results
#2 . <u>Diagnose &</u> <u>investigate</u> health problems and health hazards in community	 Assess public health labs Infectious and chronic disease epidemiology programs

Essential Service	Examples
#3 . Inform, educate and empower people about health issues	 Social marketing & media communication Provide health information
#4 . <u>Mobilize community</u> <u>partnerships</u> to identify & solve health problems	 Partnerships & coalitions with community organizations Defined health improvement planning and projects
#5 . <u>Develop policies</u> and plans that support individual & community health efforts	 Develop policy & legislation to improve health Develop & track measurable health objectives in community

Core Function:	Assurance
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Essential Service	Examples
#6 . Enforce laws and regulations that protect health & ensure safety	 Enforce housing, food quality, sanitation, & clean air codes Protect water supply
#7 . <u>Link</u> people to needed personal health service & assure the provision of health care when otherwise unavailable	 Provide culturally & linguistically appropriate materials and staff Care management programs Transportation services

Healthy People Initiative

- Goals:
 - Identify nationwide health improvement priorities to promote health and prevent disease
 - Increase public awareness & understanding of the determinants of health, disease, and disability and opportunities for progress
 - Provide measurable objectives & goals at the national, state, and local levels
 - Encourage different sectors (not just health sector) to act and improve policies/practices based on best evidence
 - Identify critical data needs
